



### Desire is the compass to discern our direction (part 1)

Pope Francis dedicated his October 12th General Audience on discernment to the theme of desire; encouraging the faithful to ask the Lord to help us know His desire for our lives. He said that “discernment is a form of searching, and searching always stems from something we lack, but somehow know.” Pope Francis noted that spiritual teachers refer to it as “‘desire’ - a nostalgia for fullness that is the sign of God’s presence in us.”

The word ‘desire’ comes from the Latin ‘de-sidus’ which means “the lack of the star,” of a reference point, to orient our path of life. “It evokes a suffering, a lack, and at the same time a tension to reach the good that is missing,” the Pope said, and hence, desire is the “compass to understand where I am and where I am going.”

Desire is not the craving of the moment. “A sincere desire knows how to touch deeply the chords of our being, which is why it is not extinguished in the face of difficulties or setbacks.” The Pope referred to instances when we are thirsty, noting that if we do not find something to drink, we do not give up. On the contrary, our yearning for water increasingly occupies our thoughts and actions, until we become willing to make any sacrifice in order to quench our thirst.

“Obstacles and failures do not stifle the desire; on the contrary, they make it even more alive in us,” the Pope said. “Unlike the desire or emotion of the moment,” he said, “desire lasts through time, even a long time, and tends to materialize.” He gave the example of a young person who wants to be a doctor, and embarks on a course of study and work that occupies years of their life. This choice means he will have to set limits, say “no” to other courses of study, avoid diversions and distractions, especially during the most intense times of study. It is thus, “the desire to give his life a direction and reach that goal enables him to overcome these difficulties.” “In effect, a value becomes beautiful and more easily achievable when it is attractive.”

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament follows Mass on Thursday and Saturday mornings for half an hour.

## Parish Finance Council Report

There has been a lot of activity in the Parish House over the past four weeks, as each room has been rearranged to accommodate our many activities in practical way. This work will continue during November, as we work to optimise the room layouts and find a neat and tidy home for each item.

The Finance Council continues to work with the Parish Pastoral Council to budget for our Masterplan projects. These are being incorporated into a 5-year budget.

And finally, we continued our work on planning and budgeting for accommodation for our new priest, who we expect to arrive in January 2023.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke


*Your endurance will win you your life.*

'Take care not to be deceived,' he said 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not so soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven.

'But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name - and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.'
